





An Exploration of Women's History Through Textiles

Records of women's voices during the 18th and 19th centuries are rare, but you can find traces of women and their experiences if you know where to look. Textiles, including the quilts and coverlets on display, are imbued with significance well beyond being utilitarian items. They were often made for or by women as wedding gifts, were created to commemorate important moments in women's lives, and they gave women an outlet to express themselves.
