

Raising the fees by \$10.00 gives us \$1,500.00 more when we have 150 members and that makes a big difference.

We would like membership **dues paid before June 30 if possible.** This would be very helpful for figuring out a budget for the following year. This decision needs the approval of the members, usually done at an AGM so I am asking for your help here. It will make things much easier for everyone it we can pay now and vote in September. Please support this decision when you renew your membership.

It has been a pleasure working with this executive and being able to rely on them for advice and sound decision making. We have tackled some very big issues and I feel we have handled them very well. The Website is the jewel in our crowns and it is working well for all who need it. There will be some sorting out in September but it looks as though all positions on the executive are filled with eager candidates. I certainly never anticipated some of the issues we have had this year. This pandemic is heartbreaking and affects so many people all over the world. I know we realize how very fortunate we are here...our lifestyle is comfortable and safe and we are able to get about freely. Losing the ability to do that is a real eye opener. COMMNUITY OUTREACH

Community Quilts

- We had our last sew day on February 28, and as usual had a great time. We have had to cancel our other sew days that were scheduled and I'm sure we are all missing the fun of sewing together.
- In the mean time we have still been busy. I've heard from a number of quilters that you are busy piecing tops, using up your scraps and your stash! With the current requirements to stay home, I am not able to schedule any pick-ups or drop offs of fabric, batting or completed quilts. So please just keep working on whatever you have at home for now.
- Our YWCA challenge is on going. We've committed to making a total of 40 quilts for the new transitional housing units by January 2021. Ten quilts need to be double size (approximately 80"x 90") and 30 need to be twin-size (approximately 70" x 90"). I wonder whether that date will get pushed back with all that is going on, but let's keep working on this challenge as we can at home.
- The Family and Children's Services (FACS) Niagara initiative is also underway. Thank you to those that have already donated some lovely baby quilts that will be given to newly fostered babies. This is another great place to use up those bits and pieces of baby and child fabric you have in your stash. The quilt should be approximately 40" x 40" with flannel backing. - Sharree Eidt was instrumental in applying for a grant for us to buy batting and wide back fabric for the YWCA challenge. Thanks so much, Sharree! We're still waiting to hear if we got it, we'll let you know!

- you need to cut out your own choice of fabric, fleece and stabilizer BEFORE THE WORKSHOP. This is very important if you are to complete your project and learn from Brenda.

She will be bringing the zippers (39 colors) and D rings (antique brass or nickel) to pick out during class.
