COMMUNITY QUILTS

Our community quilters continue to be quite active in sewing tops, quilting and binding quilts. Thanks so much to everyone for your ongoing hard work and contributions to Community Quilts, and thanks to those who contributed larger pieces of fabric for backing. Eric Muller has also generously donated fabric and projects from Alice's stash, and we're grateful for that.

Our YWCA challenge for the transitional housing unit is going well. We have a total of 27 completed twin quilts (we need a total of 30). We also have a total of eight completed double quilts (we need a total of 10). I am confident we will meet and exceed our goal! We currently still have some batting, thanks to another generous donor, but we will need more before long. If you have ideas about where to get donations for batting, please let me know.

Our FACS baby quilts initiative continues to be highly successful with a total of 67 baby quilts donated. This is another great place to use up those bits and pieces of baby and child fabric you have in your stash. The quilt should be approximately 40" x 40" with flannel backing. Thirty quilts (20 adult, 10 child) were recently donated to the YWCA Shelter in St. Catharines, eight were donated to the Pathstone live-in home (Rotary House) in Niagara Falls, and one was donated to a trauma survivor.


I love your play. It's a hoot. Even I can identify with some of the situations, though not a sewing person. CT


