# Community Outreach

Thank you once again for all your hard work and contributions to our Community Quilts. So many of you are busy sewing, binding, and quilting – you truly are an inspiration! If you are getting low on your stash, or just want some different fabric to play with, please contact Jennifer, and I can put together a fabric bundle for you.

Our YWCA challenge for the transitional housing unit is a success! We have exceeded our goal of 30 twin quilts and 10 double quilts. The latest word is that the housing unit will open in March, so we are ahead of schedule! If you are still working on a twin or double size quilt for this challenge, please continue. We have other places we donate to that want these larger size quilts; rather then just lap size quilts.

Another 51 baby quilts have been donated, thank you everyone! We have learned that there are a number of Indigenous babies and children in FACS care. To bring an early appreciation of their culture to these precious babies, we are offering the Squash Blossom kit. Available January 5, 2021, choose 1) fabric for pieced top and pattern; 2) fabric for top, backing, binding, plus batting and pattern; or 3) pattern if you prefer to use your own materials. Thank you to Lorna Costantini (lornacostantini.com) for the Squash Blossom pattern. According to Iroquois legend, corn, beans, and squash are three inseparable sisters who only grow and thrive together. Three quilts were donated to Niagara Region Mental Health, Hope Recovered program. Other donations to our usual places are still on hold.

As always, our greatest need is batting. Fortunately, Kathleen O'Flaherty has successfully raised \$235 selling donated items on Facebook Marketplace, which allowed us to purchase another roll of batting. Please check out our listings labelled with CQ – there are some good deals there and all money raised helps us keep going.

Finally, another reminder to please save your UPC labels from Hobbs batting packages. With five UPC labels, we can order a roll of Hobbs 80/20 for a drastically reduced cost through their charity program. 
