## COMMUNITY OUTREACH

We have been able to donate some quilts lately, as Ontario opens up more. We have given 20 adult quilts and 10 baby quilts to the Niagara Regional Native Centre, and 10 quilts to Gillian's Place. Additionally, the YWCA quilts (48 quilts: 10 double, 30 twin, 1 lap size, and 7 baby) were donated on August 19 to the newly built transitional housing unit at 176 Oakdale. The quilts were presented to Laurie Andrews (YWCA Board Member), Arienne Good (YWCA Fundraising and Donor Relations) and Elizabeth Zimmerman (YWCA Executive Director). A reporter from Niagara This Week was also there and we should see the story published soon. We spread some of the quilts out on the grass in front of the building, and everyone was very excited and so thankful for the donation. A few residents happened by while we were there and were also very excited to learn that they would be receiving a quilt. The YWCA staff was so grateful for the donation, and indicated that it means so many of you care about what happens to marginalized people in our community. Thank you so much to all of you who made this possible.

As we are not yet though with this pandemic, keep sewing on your own for Community Outreach. No particular size is needed at this point, although we always do seem to have a need for bed size quilts. ## NEONATAL

Thanks to our generous members, I delivered 125 neonatal quilts in June 2021. The nursery was low on quilts and they were happy for the donation. The total number of babies born was 3,388. The love you put in your quilt is appreciated by the staff and parents.

To make these Quilts here are the requirements:

- Neo-Natal quilts should not be any larger than 22 to 24 inches square
- The front or top of the quilt may be made from either cotton or flannelette. You may be as creative with the top as you wish.
- The backing must be flannelette, and have no seams (there is no batting put in these quilts).

Simply lay top of quilt and backing fabric right sides together stitch around the edge leaving an opening. Turn right side out and top stitch around the edge.

## MEALS ON WHEELS REPORT

Meals on Wheels is an organization which provides a hot and nutritious meal once a day from Monday to Friday to the area shut ins and seniors in their own homes. Each year the guild donates placemats to this organization who then distributes them at Christmas. The St.Catharines/Thorold chapter distributes around 350 meals. Quite often this is the only present the recipient receives.

The following are some suggestions for making the placemats:

The finished size should measure about 12 in. by 18 in. Make them reversible with Christmas on one side and another season on the other. Applique a cut out from a large print on background fabric and add borders. Use an orphan block or make a log cabin block and add borders. They can be done for any season; they don't have to be Christmas themed.

Try the quilt as you go placemat pattern attached.

Soup Bowl Koozie

A client of Meals On Wheels, who is a former quilter, suggested that we might like to make Soup Bowl Koozies, as putting the meals in the microwave can make them quite hot. Attached, you will find instructions on how to make a Koozie. This might give you something different to make.

Completed placemats and/or Koozies need to be done by mid November. Delivery to specific members will be shared at a later date.

# Quilt-as-You-Go Self Binding Placemats

Finished size:- 17" x 12" (This just fits my fabric best)

Materials:- Strips of fabric - (cut 1 1/2" to 2 1/2" wide and 12" long) Batting - cut 17" x 12" ( I like "Fuse-a-Shade" ) Backing fabric - cut 20" x 15"

Method:- Place batting on wrong side of backing fabric, leaving an 1 1/2" border around the batting.

Place a fabric strip, right side up, in the middle of the placemat. (fiq.L) Place a second fabric strip, on top of the first strip, right sides together and sew down one side with a 1/4" seam. (fig. 2)

Open up second strip & press down flat. (fig. 3)

Place 3rd strip on top of second, & sew down seam with 1/4" Open up third strip and iron down flat.

Continue sewing down strips, in this method, until all of the batting is

covered.

Work the opposite side as the first.

Fold the extra backing fabric over the placemat with a double fold to Binding:create a 3/4" binding. Topstitch binding in place. (fig. 4.)









#### **Soup Bowl Koozie**

#### (Read all directions before beginning)

#### Supplies:

(2) 10%" squares of cotton fabric

(1) 10" square of microwaveable 100% cotton or 50% cotton-50% bamboo batting. This batting does not have any skrim or poly in it and can be safely used in the microwave. Remember to use 100% cotton thread and fabric without any polyester or glitz.

#### **Directions:**

You will be sewing a dart on each side of the square. Fold one square in half RST (right sides together), so it measures 5%" x 10%" Measure %" from fold at each raw edge. Mark 3" down along fold and make a mark. Pin folded side and sew dart from %" mark to 3" long mark. Repeat for other side. Open fabric and repeat fold, mark and sew darts. Press darts to one side.

On right side of second square, draw diagonal lines from corner to corner with an erasable marker. Centre the batting on the wrong side of the square, pinning at corners. Repeat darts on all four sides of this unit, sewing the dart through the fabric and batting. Carefully cut batting out of dart to reduce bulk.

Press dart to one side.

Layer fabrics together RST.

Pin and sew ¼" around edges, leaving a 4" turning spot open.

You should be sewing right along the edge of the batting. Try not to include the batting in the seam allowance.

Clip corners and turn through opening. Batting will have to be nudged into place since it is not sewn in the seam around the raw edge.

Stitch opening closed and topstitch around outer edges.

Quilt on diagonal lines and voila! A bowl koozie to use to keep from burning your hands when you remove hot soup or cereal from the microwave.

Simply set your bowl in the middle of the koozie and place in the microwave. Lift hot bowl by opposite corners.

Machine washable.
