GIVING BACK

COMMUNITY OUTREACH REPORT

As of this writing, a total of 148 quilts have been donated this year. In addition, Kathleen O'Flaherty has facilitated donation of more than 50 baby quilts this year to FACS (Project Noah) and the Niagara Regional Native Centre. More tops have been donated, and a number are still in process of being quilted or bound. Everyone certainly has been prolific this year! Thank you to everyone who has contributed to piecing, quilting, binding or donating fabric or batting. All of this would not be possible without you. Our recent donations are a private donation to 5 children who were abused, 13 lap-sized quilts to Hospice, 4 lap-sized quilts to Hope Recovered (a Niagara Mental Health program), 9 of varying sizes to the Native Centre, and 4 twin size to people displaced by the Hernder fire.

We had a small, but successful sew day on Monday April 4 at Kathryn Karr's home. A few people that had planned to attend could not for varying reasons, but we ended up with myself, Karen Jantz, Lynne Wilkinson, and of course, Kathryn. We did a lot of organizing and sorting of all the fabrics and projects brought back from my home to Kathryn's, binding on some quilts, some piecing, etc. I will bring quilts that need quilting, or binding, and project starters to the next meeting. Stop by the Community Outreach table and pick up something to do!

I want to thank everyone for the opportunity to serve you and this community in my role as Coordinator for Community Quilts. A special thank you to Kathleen O'Flaherty, my assistant, who has supported me in so many ways with this work. We kept working during our COVID lockdowns, thanks in large part to Kathleen who raised \$485 so we could buy batting. I took over in January 2018 from Linda Chambers and we have been going strong ever since. We have done some amazing things in those 4.5 years! The total number of quilts donated during this time is 504 quilts, plus many, many baby quilts which specifically happened through Kathleen's initiative. I am stepping down from this role, and giving someone else the opportunity to envision where Community Outreach should go next. It has truly been rewarding for me to see the joy that all these quilts bring to people. Thanks so much for entrusting me with all the beautiful quilts you have made.

PROGRAMS AND WORKSHOPS REPORT

As the Ontario Emergency Orders for the Covid 19 Pandemic continued to play havoc with our lives, so the Programs and Workshops Committee adapted this past fall as per provincial guidelines. Presenters who were scheduled were cancelled and planning started for a January Shop Hop that did not materialize due to further pandemic restrictions. We were happy to see everyone who attended the March general meeting. At this meeting a survey was conducted and thank-you to the 55 members who completed the Survey.

Here are the conclusions that have been determined from your responses:

55% of those who answered **No** to why they had not taken a workshop were due to work and other commitments and 29% had too many UFO's.

People are interested in 3 workshops a year and half day workshops as well.

There is a demand for learning new techniques, which emphasizes developing creativity. These included: wall art, landscape quilts, mosaic technique, freehand, applique, curved piecing, wack and stack, cloth dolls, and wool applique.

People would also like to make quilted clothing, which is also a creative direction. Under embellishment, suggestions included crazy quilt squares, hand stitch beads and buttons and embroidery. There are some people interested in making bed quilts. Machine techniques people asked for were sewing with a long arm, machine embroidery, and how to use a machine to quilt and free motion techniques. A variety of guild member's names were shared for future considerations in workshops.

Again, thank you for your feedback. The Programs and Workshops Committee will endeavour to consider these suggestions in their fall planning within their budget allotment. If you would like to make these conclusions happen, please consider joining our committee. Thank you to committee members Luci Ronald and Judy Yovanovich for all their support.


