# HAPPY NEW YEAR

One of the most popular customs we have as we begin a New Year is to make a resolution, or perhaps several resolutions. This is a time when we reflect on the previous year, re-evaluate our goals and achievements, set new goals or make changes in our personal lives.



As I reflect on 2022, I'm amazed by what we have accomplished as a Guild. We resumed holding our monthly general meetings and celebrated the Guild's 40th Anniversary with 102 members in attendance as well as some founding members who gave us a presentation on our history. Our community quilters generously donated approximately 90 community quilts to various organizations, we delivered 238 placemats and 26 koozies to Meals on Wheels, and 226 Neonatal Quilts to the Special Care Nursery at the St. Catharine's General Hospital. We were also happy to resume our annual donation to RAFT in support of at-risk youth in the Niagara region. We were successful in granting a Scholarship of \$1,000.00. Our 50/50 draw generated \$914.15 and our Loonie draw \$516.00. Our programs and workshop committee has worked very hard to offer us unique programs and all this was achieved with Covid 19 still a very real presence in our lives.

Our membership has held steady with 154 members at which 70 are also members of our private Facebook group.

Our objectives and/or goals for 2023 are to grow our membership and to recruit a Fundraising Chair to help support not only our community quilters but also other important guild initiatives. Our new community quilt team has identified the organizations we want to support and their needs so we can focus our energies. She was a passionate advocate of the arts as well as a generous Philanthropist. She was also one of the first to employ new technologies in the design and execution of quilts. In 1992 her book, *Ontario's Heritage*

In 1992 her book, *Ontario's Heritage Quilts*, was awarded the Canadian Historical Association Award of Merit, an award normally presented to academic historians, for its contribution to regional history. In 2002 The Canadian Quilters Association presented her with the Dorothy McMurdie Award, its most prestigious award, for her significant contributions to Canadian quilting." Making it even more special, Marilyn signed the book to Ethel Saveall, also a founding member. Thank you, Verna Fry (Ethel's daughter and a charter member) for donating this book to us.

We had a very successful "sew day" at Kathryn Karr's on November 12. Fabric was sorted and we took stock of the finished quilts on hand. A roll of batting was ordered and has come in, so additional quilt tops can be matched up with backing etc. and can be completed in the new year. Another sew day is scheduled January 12, 2023. Future sew days will be announced as they become available.

Thank you to everyone for the monies that were collected at the November meeting towards the purchase of batting. Our batting angel donation box will be available at the membership table at every meeting.

I was also honored to drop off 10 completed quilts to the Kristen French Advocacy Centre, on behalf of the Guild. They have 2 quilt ladders to display the quilts for the children to choose from. I was able to obtain statistics on the breakdown of children who go through the center. The numbers are approximately 2/3 girls and 1/3 boys. Also the younger children seem to gravitate to a stuffed animal and the little older ones to a quilt. This information will assist us in making quilts accordingly. 
