#### **Officer Positions**

Vice President: Assist President when required. (this position does not automatically

Organize an annual quilt challenge.

Liaison with various committees as required and sit on Publicity.

Time requirements: 5-10 hours a month.

Secretary: Record and minutes of all executive and general meetings.

Correct and distribute said minutes.

Respond to correspondence and send out bereavement cards as required.

Act as a signing officer for bank accounts. Time commitment: 8-10 hours a month.

50/50 draw and Loonie draw.

Time commitment: 8-10 hours a month.

#### **GIVING BACK**

#### **COMMUNITY QUILTS**

5 quilts have been delivered to Hospice. They have asked if we could provide single bed size quilts to them, as those are currently in demand. They have some lap size on hand, but these are not as desired. The desired size should be at least  $55^{\circ}$  –  $60^{\circ}$  wide by  $75^{\circ}$  –  $80^{\circ}$  in length.

The next "sew day" at Kathryn Karr's home, will be Thursday March 9. At the last sew day, fabric was sorted and an assortment of Christmas fabric will be available at the Community Outreach table at the March meeting, to be used for the Meals on Wheels placemats.

Please note, that we have posted "Fabric Donation Guidelines" on the website. There is presently a good amount of fabric, but batting continues to be the greatest expense. We have placed an "Angel" on the membership table to collect any monies that you may be able to contribute towards the purchase of batting. Also keep in mind that if you have any empty bags from Hobbs Quilt Batting, we can submit 5 of the UPC codes to be able to purchase a 30 yd. roll of batting at a reduced cost. This is limited to organizations that produce charity quilts only.




