CHRISTMAS CRAFTS WORKSHOP



Folded Origami Hexagon Ornament

Participants will be making one ornament. Prepared fabric, button, and hanging loop will be provided by the instructor. Please take a sewing kit with the following items in it: sewing needle, light coloured thread, pins or clips, sharp pencil, small fabric scissors, and a pointy tool (a stiletto, purple thang or cuticle stick.

Quilted Christmas Star Ball Ornament

These festive ornaments capture the style of handmade quilting patterns without any sewing. Despite using the name "quilted," nothing is quilted for this ornament. In fact, it's a completely nosew project. Participants are asked to bring along the following items: 200 flathead pins, thimble, small ruler, 2 ½ "X w.o.f. in three contrasting colours, ribbon to finish. Please let us know if you would like us to provide the already cut 2 ½" squares and flathead pins to complete the ornament. Styrofoam balls will be provided by the instructor.





Tabletop Christmas Tree - CLASS FULL

Precut 2 ½ inch fabric squares and pins will be provided. You are responsible for supplying your own cone.



Christmas Cards - CLASS FULL

You will be creating two cards. Fabric will be supplied for the first card. Bring Green fabric for the other card.

If you have 1" Sewing Head Pins bring them with you.


