

Quilter's Soup

Recipe

- 1. Fill a jar with soup mix (2 ¹/₂" strips of fabric of any length) of your choice, can be as many or as few of each fabric as you like. It can be any "Flavour" you like but remember a variety of ingredients that blend well together make wonderful and tasty soup!
- 2. Bring the filled jar to the November 27, 2024, general meeting. The jars will be put in a large bag or box, and you will pick without looking at the fabric. No one will know who's jar they got.
- 3. To make your project remember: You may add broth (one fabric of your choice) to the mix. You can make anything you like but use at the very least half of the soup mix.
- 4. Bring back your totally finished project to the April 23, 2025, general meeting and deliver it to Maureen Augerman. No extensions. Prizes will be awarded at the May 28, 2025, AGM.

Community Quilts

There were 2 successful sewing days in September and October where up to 12 people catalogued completed quilts, sorted received fabric donations, measured, and cut backing for quilt tops and put together quilt sandwiches ready to go out to the long armers.

In October, the group focused on preparing for the Placemat/Pillowcase workshop by matching materials for the pillowcases and making sure we had a variety of fabrics for the placemats. Nine quilts were donated to people who experienced a house fire or needed a comfort quilt while they dealt with medical issues.

Some kits were picked up at our Guild meetings but there are many more waiting to be sewn. Many people also help to bind and label the quilted quilts in their own home which is greatly appreciated.

Meals on Wheels

Presently, there are 50 finished placemats, but we know there are many that are being sewn at home and there will be many more finished at the Placemat Workshop. Just a reminder that the preferred size is 12" x17" and they should be made from 100% cotton. Any pattern and combination of fabric is greatly appreciated.

Also, please help add to our Christmas Card pile (non-religious) by signing the cards with a greeting e.g. Warm Winter Wishes, Happy Holidays, Seasons Greetings, and Niagara Heritage Quilters' Guild inside. If you have any Christmas stickers, you could seal the back of the cards with one. The last day Placemats and cards will be collected is at our November 27th Guild general meeting.
